4H - Junior Show Information

Juniors must bring a separate bird, not entered in either Show, for Showmanship.

Junior show birds will be eligible for open and junior awards. Junior birds will be cooped in with open show birds. The judge will judge all birds in the class for open show. Then the judge will pick from the JUNIOR birds only for junior show awards.

4-H Membership, or CPA membership is not required to enter. Juniors must be under 18 years of age at the time of judging.

Junior show rules will be the same as the open show with the following addition:

All birds in the junior show **MUST** be cooped in, prepped, and cared for by the JUNIOR exhibitor.

We are encouraging more of a hands-on learning experience for the juniors of the fancy. We acknowledge that there are some very young competitors who are new at showing poultry. Therefore, we have some adults and older juniors who can assist the younger junior members in reading coop cards, and learning how to prep birds, etc.



EGG SHOW (full APA guide can be found at amerpoultryassn.com) Entries will be taken the day of the show only until 12 Noon. Bring three of your best eggs of any color which will go into the classes **DECORATED**, white, brown, chocolate, blue/green or olive. Entries are \$2.50 each or 5 entries for \$10. (3 eggs of same class required per entry)


Photo Booth the CPA has a photo booth for all exhibitors to take pictures of birds. All birds making it to champion row will be photographed. This photo booth setup was donated by longtime club member and supporter "Cowboy Bob" Nylander.

<u>BACKYARD CLASS</u> if you have a bird that you just don't know if its show ready. Is this your first show and don't know where to start? No Disqualification's, if it's not in the standard that ok, mixed breeds ok, just mark "BACKYARD" on your entry form under breed. Birds must still be healthy, Bug/Mite free.


Example of the COOP card found on every cage:

- Coop# is for show staff record keeping. (Coop#101)
- Exhibitor number will be at the top under the Club's name. You will receive your exhibitor number when checking in. (ex. Exhibitor #20)
- Class is the class your bird is in according to the APA/ABA standard. (ex. Large -American)
- Breed and Variety is listed in center. (ex. White Chantecler)
- Gender is listed at bottom (ex. Cock)
- Band number you can write in below the gender if desired at the show.

Band numbers are not needed on the entry forms

• Please do not write on coop card until after judging.

<u>Entry Forms</u> Only one line is needed for each variety entered. You *only* put the NUMBER OF BIRDS for each gender.



This example entry of Bantam Buff Brahma's has 4 Cock birds, 5 Hens, 1 Cockerels and 4 pullets for a total of 12 Birds.

DC= Double Coop. All attempts will be made to accommodate double coop requests space permitting. Double coops are for big birds who need 2 coops to accommodate the size...example Male Leghorns with long tails, Male Rhode Island Reds, Large Fowl Cochin Males.

-Please note under variety if your breed is bearded or non-bearded (Silkies, Polish etc...)

Show Rules



- 1. Entries must be **RECEIVED** by the deadline. (This is not a postmark by date)
- 2. NEW exhibitors that have not shown with the CPA before the COOP fee will be paid by the club as a welcome to the show.
- 3. Specify "Junior" on the entry form if that bird is to be entered in the Junior Show. otherwise, all birds will be entered in the Open Show.
- 4. Juniors, please bring a separate bird to be used in the Showmanship Competition if possible.
- 5. Any bird showing evidence of infectious/contagious diseases, or parasite, will be removed from the show and isolated. Entry fees will not be reimbursed.
- 6. Each exhibitor will feed and water their entries, raffle, and/or sale birds.
- 7. No person other than Club officers, show staff, and judges will be allowed to handle the birds without permission of the owner.
- 8. No exhibitor is permitted to move coop cards without first talking to the show management.
- 9. The CPA & fairgrounds and their agents will not be held responsible for any lost, stolen, or injured birds/ items.
- 10. Any bird entered will not be reimbursed for entry fees if bird is not brought to the show.
- 11. Judging for both the Junior Show and Open Show will be done by the latest APA and ABA Standards.
- 12. Cash awards will be distributed to the winners providing there are six (6) or more entries in that class.
- 13. Sale cage spaces are available on a first come first serve basis. Please do not overcrowd the birds in the sale cages or you will be asked to remove some and purchase another cage.
- 14. The owner is responsible for sale, feeding, watering their own stock. **No out of box or tailgate sales are allowed.**
- 15. Please be sure that **all birds are cooped in by 8:45 AM** on the day of the show. Judging will start at 9:00 AM sharp.
- 16. NO EARLY COOP OUT—Early coop-outs will forfeit awards and future entry.
- 17. Entries will be taken on a first come basis, if the showroom fills up the last entries will be refunded and turned away. The CPA will make any reasonable effort to accommodate all entries. Show bird entries will be taken at the highest priority over any sale cage entry.
- 18. Rules are subject to changes at any time. Please be nice this is a fun hobby for us!



ROSETTES to Champion and Reserve Champion Bantam Ribbons to Best and Reserve of Class provided there are 50 or more shown.

A free listing plus a Bantam Buck is provided in the upcoming ABA Yearbook for all Best and Reserve of the seven bantam classes with a minimum of 50.

Star pins will be awarded to all wins in classes of 100 or more.

All wins in Classes of 100 or more will be denoted with a star * and be retained in the ABA records to accumulate towards the Master Exhibitor, Master Breeder, and Lifetime Achievement awards. Only ABA members are eligible to compete for the above awards. Dues are \$25.00 per year \$70.00 for three years.

New members receive a copy of the quarterly and the latest available copy of the Annual American Bantam Association Year Book which lists many advertisers and includes a complete breed and variety index. Winners of ABA awards are listed in the yearbook under Who's Who in Bantams.

Starred wins are earned in classes of 100 or more in the following:

- Champions and Reserve Champions in the seven bantam divisions. (1/2 stars (starting in 2022) are awarded to these wins in class sizes 50-99.
 - Best and Reserve of Breed and Variety.
 - Best Display when 7 or more bantam displays are shown
 - Best and Reserve Display when 10 or more bantam displays are shown.
 - Best and Reserve Trio when 30 or more trios are shown by 4 or more exhibitors.
 - A single bird is eligible for only one award and can earn only one starred win.

Poultry

NOTE: Poultry includes chickens, turkeys, ostriches, emus, rheas, cassowaries, waterfowl, game birds, and hatching eggs.

- 1. Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) issued by an accredited veterinarian within 30 days.
- . Exemption: Birds that originate from an NPIP participating flock in good standing may use VS Form 9-3 in lieu of a CVI.
 - 2. Negative Pullorum-Typhoid Test within 60 days (for turkeys 6 months and older, all other poultry 4 months and older) prior to entry if the flock is not an NPIP participating flock.

CSU Avian Health Program

The Colorado Avian Health Program at CSU often offers voluntary screening of birds as they come into the showroom. **This is not mandatory but recommended.**

Youth Showmanship

The CPA will be hosting showmanship for youth. Please sign up at the Youth Activities Table Saturday morning. Tentative classes for Pre-Junior, Novice, Junior, and Senior. **Showmanship birds should not be entered for exhibition** as they may be out of their cage for showmanship when their breed is judged.

Showdown—ANYTHING but Black and White

Last year we had a Black and white showdown. SO this year we are having an **ANYTHING BUT** black and white bird showdown. Every bird in the showdown will be considered its own class in addition to the standard show. 1st place wins ½ the pot. 2nd place will receive ¼ of the pot. The last ¼ goes to the club to pay for the junior show awards.

For over a decade, Marilyn Uilk has been a dedicated member of the CPA. Since 2016, she has served as Vice President, working tirelessly to support the poultry community and inspire future generations of poultry enthusiasts.

Marilyn's journey in the poultry world began with her mother, Marge Ussery, a longtime CPA member and well-respected figure in the chicken



community. Marge, who had the 2019 CPA show dedicated to her, was instrumental in introducing Marilyn and her daughter, Maddie, to poultry. While Marilyn grew up in New Mexico with no initial interest in



chickens—preferring to show horses instead—her daughter's fascination with Marge's silkies quickly pulled the family into the world of poultry. At nine years old, Maddie became captivated by her grandmother's birds, sparking a passion that Marilyn embraced as well. What started as a shared family interest has since grown into a multi-generational tradition, now known as *Triple 'M' Silkies*.

Beyond breeding and showing silkies, Marilyn is a cornerstone of the CPA. She is always the first to step up—whether leading educational seminars, mentoring young silkie enthusiasts, judging showmanship, or tackling the endless task of washing chickens (which yes, is endless). At any CPA event, you'll find Marilyn setting up, organizing, and staying until the last table is folded. Her dedication, generosity, and hard work make her an invaluable part of the poultry community.

Even after Marge's passing and Maddie's move to Hawaii for her doctoral studies, Marilyn has continued the family's "crazy silkie people" legacy. She still breeds silkies and regularly attends shows, with a special fondness for paints and buffs—colors rich in family history. Marge was known for her buff silkies, and Maddie, having grown up with a paint horse, naturally gravitated toward paint silkies. Yet, for Marilyn, CPA has always been about more than just the birds—it's about the friendships, the camaraderie, and the future of the poultry community. She cherishes the lifelong connections she has made and looks forward to sharing her love

for poultry with the next generation, including her future grandchildren.

As her daughter, I can say without hesitation that no one is more deserving of this honor. Congratulations, Mama—you've truly earned it!
